



Financial Aid FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)

What is the best time to apply for aid?

To be considered for financial aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) *as early as possible after October 1st*. You do not have to be an applicant for admission to complete the FAFSA; however, you must be accepted to Wentworth in order to receive notification of your actual financial aid award.

Wentworth's priority filing date for first year students entering in the fall semester is **March 1, 2019**. Because financial aid is awarded on a first come, first-serve basis, we urge you to file your forms as early as possible. There are several federal and institutional funds that are depleted rather quickly and filing early is the only way to ensure that you don't miss a funding opportunity.

What application is required for me to file for financial assistance?

FAFSA: The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is available from your high school guidance office. If you are unable to obtain an application, call Wentworth's Student Service Center and one can be mailed to you. You may also complete the form online at **www.fafsa.ed.gov**.

Other Forms:

Federal Tax Returns: You are strongly encouraged to use the FAFSA IRS data retrieval process, a faster way to provide tax information through the FAFSA. Applicants may request their IRS Data Retrieval three weeks after filing federal tax returns (both parent and student). If you have already filed your FAFSA, please update your Student Aid Report (SAR) once you and your parent's tax returns have been filed. Students and parents who do not or cannot use the IRS data retrieval process when filing a FAFSA, will be required to provide a 2017 IRS tax transcript. Non-Tax Filer Form: If you are selected for verification and you did not file a federal tax return, you may be required to complete a non-tax filer form.

Please DO NOT send these forms unless they are requested.

What types of aid are available?

Grants or Scholarships: Sources of grants or scholarships are federal, state, and/or institutional. These funds are credited directly to tuition, and do not have to be repaid.

Loans: Sources of loans are federal, state, or private. Loan funds must be repaid. Some loans have a grace period that allows the student to begin repayment after they have graduated. There are also some loans that are available to parents.

Work-Study: Work-Study is a federal program that is awarded to those students who meet eligibility guidelines established by the Financial Aid Office. Students awarded work-study can obtain a job on campus and receive a biweekly paycheck for those hours worked. Most students work between 6-12 hours per week.

Does Wentworth offer scholarships based on merit?

All accepted students are automatically considered for a merit award scholarship based on the competitiveness of their application for admission. Are there other sources of aid?

Who should I contact if I have questions on the financial aid process?

Wentworth is committed to serving students and their families on a personal level. Each student is assigned a financial aid counselor who will guide them through the process of applying for financial aid, discuss alternative financing options, and demonstrate how to meet the expected bill each semester. When is my tuition due?

Tuition for the fall semester is due, in full, August 1st. You will be billed for the spring semester in November, which is due early December.

Does Wentworth offer a payment plan?

Yes. At Wentworth we understand that it can be difficult to cover your total bill all at once. With this in mind, Wentworth offers a payment plan, which allows you to pay your bill in equal monthly installments.
