## **Berklee Vets Uniting the Online and Campus Communities**

Does your college have an online Veteran affiliated community? If it does you may have experienced the same challenges that we have experienced at Berklee College of Music. After a lot of time and effort working toward uniting the two communities, we now have momentum and are hoping to hold our first Virtual event in the fall semester 2025. We wanted to share our journey in the hopes it may help other schools who want to do the same.

Berklee College of Music is a private school with tuition that exceeds the basic G.I. Bill tuition benefits. Berklee provides a very generous Yellow Ribbon contribution, however it still makes attending the school on campus challenging for many Veterans and their dependents. The result is a smaller on-campus Veteran affiliated community. The Berklee on-line program is much more affordable for G.I. Bill benefit users, and we have seen that we have a large number of Veteran affiliated students within the On-line community.

When I arrived at Berklee, one of my personal goals was to help the Berklee SVA grow the Veteran affiliated musicians' network of Berklee students and alumni. To achieve this, we developed a strategic plan which included the following pillars:

- 1) Increase Berklee Awareness of Veteran Affiliated Students
- 2) Find a way to integrate the On-line Veteran Affiliated Community with the Campus Veteran Affiliated Community
- 3) Propose ways to increase the Veteran Affiliated population
- 4) Propose and demonstrate the benefits of more veteran services and Veteran network opportunities within Berklee
- 5) Establish a self-sustaining Veteran Affiliated Alumni Network Some of our priorities in the effort to execute this strategy were the following:
- 1) Establish and maintain healthy and enduring relationships with Berklee leadership and departments.
- 2) Work to show the value proposition for Berklee in their support of these efforts by asking ourselves "how are we helping Berklee achieve its mission?"
- 3) Ensure the Veteran affiliated community's needs are central to what we are doing, always.
- 4) Represent our broader Veteran Community in a professional and respectful manner.

With these ideas, the Berklee Student Veteran Affiliated (SVA) Community is now planning to host our first joint event combining the online and campus SVA communities. So how did we get here?

The first step in this process was meeting with the Military Affairs Manager at Berklee. We had our first strategic meeting two years ago to communicate our ideas/goals and to ask for help in bringing key Berklee representatives to the table. At the same time, we began an effort to rebrand. The club was originally titled "Student Veteran Association." This led other

Berklee students to see it as only for the U.S. Veterans and nobody else. We changed the name to "Student Veteran Affiliated Community" and began spreading the message that we are a club welcoming Veterans from foreign nations, along with any friends/family members of, or students interested in knowing Veterans. This rebranding allows us to serve a larger Berklee population and will allow us to be more active

within the Berklee community.

Next, we held a "Sip with Vets" event, where we had coffee and donuts. We made ourselves available for anyone who wanted to have some coffee and just chat with us. The event was very successful and was a big step towards making our community more visible and relatable. We are planning to partner with other Berklee clubs in the fall to co-host events and continue growing our campus presence, which will help us in seeking more advocacy for our efforts. We have also increased our social media presence and plan to put greater effort into it as we become more active in fall 2025.

We have spent a lot of time socializing the idea of uniting the on-line and campus Veteran affiliated communities. Like many schools, the on-line community for Berklee is a separate service, which creates administrative and technical challenges to reaching both communities simultaneously. We knew we would need to show the value of committing the time and effort to find a way to do it for Berklee. The attention we have brought to our very small community on campus, along with the incredible efforts or our military affairs manager, led to the inclusion of Veteran specific questions on the Berklee On-Line Student Survey sent out this Spring. The results of that survey revealed an overwhelming desire for the On-line Veteran community to be connected to the campus community.

We enjoyed a very productive meeting in July discussing the plan to implement our ideas. This includes an announcement and invitation for our virtual event to introduce the community and then determining how to manage the communications going forward. This is an incredible step, because we (Berklee Student Club Staff Leadership and the Military Affairs Manager) are now discussing how to make a sustainable community that is not dependent on the student club or any individual members which will open the door to communicate with other Berklee Leadership.

It has taken two years, a lot of conversations, and lots of persistence to get to where we are, but we are seeing things move in the right direction. The best part is that by developing our relationships, we are getting more traction with each conversation. We will provide an update after we have held our first virtual event. ### From Service to Student: Supporting Military Connected Students in Higher Education By Nolan Buck

Transitioning from military service to college is a journey filled with both strengths and unique challenges. As a Marine Corps veteran and Director of Military and Veteran Services at Fitchburg State University, I've seen and firsthand experienced the pride, resilience, and leadership that military-connected students bring to campus. I've also personally faced the difficulties that come with moving from military life to college, which helps me truly understand the challenges these students encounter. Recognizing these experiences is essential to creating spaces where military-connected students can thrive.

For many veterans and military students, college is about more than just academics. The military often "spits you out" into civilian life and leaves you to figure things out on your own. While the system has made improvements, this gap remains a significant challenge. The military provides structure, clear missions, and a close-knit community, but once service ends, veterans must navigate a world that demands self-direction in an environment that can feel unfamiliar and unpredictable. This sudden shift can cause uncertainty and feelings of isolation. veterans Meanwhile, often juggling are paperwork, health concerns, and the search for new purposes as they adjust to civilian life.



Those still serving in the National Guard or Reserves face even more challenges, balancing drills, deployments, and schoolwork. Many hesitate to seek accommodations or support because they worry about being misunderstood or judged.

Military-connected students juggle many responsibilities, including family, work, health, and service commitments. That's why policies need to be flexible and understanding, ensuring no one feels penalized for serving or those that have served and face obstacles while pursuing an education.

Higher education is changing. More adult learners, returning or starting college later in life while balancing jobs and families, are becoming a vital part of campus communities. Military connected students are a big part of this shift, and it's important that both veterans and support systems work together to meet their needs. It's equally important that military and veteran students know they have to actively ask for help and shouldn't feel like the "odd one out" for doing so.

Building bridges to welcome and include military-connected students is critical. When these students feel valued and part of a community, they're more likely to stay and succeed. That means creating spaces and events where they and their families feel at home, not just showing up for class and leaving. Veteran lounges, family friendly programs, and peer support groups help build connection and pride.

#### Giving Military and Veteran Students a Voice

It's critical to give military connected students meaningful opportunities to share their perspectives and help shape campus life. Too often, their experiences go unheard, leaving them feeling invisible despite their leadership and strength they have obtained while in service.

When institutions include military/veterans students in decision making, whether through student government, advisory committees, curriculum input, or peer leadership, they allow these students to reclaim ownership of their education and community. This involvement breaks down stereotypes, enriches learning for everyone, and improves policies around accommodations, mental health, and benefits.

Listening to and empowering military connected students shows respect and partnership. It builds pride, belonging, and community, key factors for recruitment and retention.

Navigating VA benefits, health challenges, family responsibilities, and academics is no small task. Programs like the GI Bill and VA healthcare offer crucial support, but understanding how to access and use these resources can be overwhelming without guidance as this is largely a bureaucratic system.

#### Supporting Military-Connected Students: Steps Campuses Can Take

Campuses can make a real difference by creating supportive environments that meet the unique needs of military connected students. Here are some practical ways institutions can enhance their support:

- Learn the Basics: Faculty, staff, and administrators don't need to be experts but having a solid understanding of key military benefits helps build empathy and flexibility.
- Simplify Processes: Providing dedicated staff to assist with VA paperwork and deadlines can reduce stress and help students focus on their studies.
- Listen and Engage: Sometimes the most meaningful support comes from simply hearing students stories and understanding the challenges they face.

Military connected students aren't asking for favors. They just want equal opportunities to succeed with those opportunities welcoming their military service. These students are mission driven and ready to excel when given the right resources and support. When campuses listen and collaborate with them, they do more than accommodate veterans, they become true champions.

At its core, this is about more than policies. It's about building community, empowering students, and creating lasting connections.


