Fall 2026 and Spring 2027 Housing Guide for Incoming First-Year Students

(Transfer and Graduate Student have a separate process)

This document is for incoming first-time first-year undergraduate students living on campus for the Fall 2026 semester. To be successful in setting up your housing assignment, you should read through this guide and check your WIT email daily. All communications will be sent to your WIT email address. This guide is organized to assist you with the application process which is step-by-step.

Housing Assignment Process: Step by Step

Action Item # 1: Submit Housing Agreement & Roommate Request

Due Date: July 1 by 4:30 p.m. ET

All students living in university housing must complete a housing agreement. Those with a housing agreement will be able to complete a roommate matching questionnaire and request one roommate. In July, the [myHousing](#) portal will auto-assign each student with an agreement.

Housing agreements are completed through your [myHousing](#) portal. Students may adjust the student information and roommate profile portions of the agreement up until the due date. The housing agreement is a legally binding document, so please read through it carefully.

Live-on Requirements

All first- and second-year students are required to live on campus to help make the transition to college smoother and more connected. We work hard to offer housing to upper-class and graduate students as well. While space isn't guaranteed beyond the second year, many students do stay on campus – especially those involved in campus life or pursuing a Co-op in Boston.

When demand for on-campus housing exceeds capacity, Wentworth partners with Colleges of the Fenway and other neighboring institutions to help provide additional housing solutions.

You can go into the [myHousing](#) portal and update your student information and roommate profile as many times as needed until 4:30 p.m. on July 1.

Home Page

On this page, you can view a short video on Housing & Residential Education. You can also view the live-on requirement.

Personal Details

Some items are read-only, as that is data pulled into the portal from our University Student Information System (SIS). If you need to update any data that is read-only, please reach out to Admissions or the Registrar.

Primary Address

You will be required to enter your primary address. This should be the address that you use for the majority of your mail. You will be required to enter in an email address. Please note that once you are an admitted student, we will only use your WIT email address. You should be checking your WIT email address as soon as you have access to it.

Addresses and Contacts

Parent/Guardian

You are required to list the address and contact information for your parent/guardian.

Emergency Contact

You should list the contact information of the person whom we would need to contact in case of an emergency.

Missing Person Contact

This can be the same as your emergency contact; however, it does not need to be. It should be the person that you want us to contact if we cannot get a hold of you.

Application Questions

This section should be completed by the student. Please be honest with your answers as this is how the system will auto-assign you with your roommates and suitemates. As a reminder, you can pull in one other person as a roommate; however, most of you will have more than one roommate. The majority of our room types are triples and quads.

Mixed-Gender Housing

Mixed Gender Housing is defined as a housing option in which two or more Wentworth students share a multiple-occupancy bedroom, apartment, or suite, in mutual agreement, regardless of the students' sex, gender, gender identity, or gender expression.

The intent of mixed gender housing is to give students the option to reside with another person of a different sex, gender, gender identity, or gender expression in order to provide a welcoming living environment. The purpose of this option is to encourage students of all gender identities and gender expressions to find more compatible living situations that allow for the comfortable development of identity within the Wentworth community.

Wentworth discourages students who are in a romantic relationship from living together in a residential housing unit. Further, we recommend that students communicate with parents or family members about the decision to live in a mixed gender housing environment. Housing & Residential Education encourages this conversation between parents or family members and students about the housing choice so that they can be informed of the student's decision.

If you selected "Yes, I prefer to live in Mixed-Gender Housing", you have been placed in this cohort, and if you plan to form or join a roommate group, **only students who also selected this option will appear in your results.**

Thematic Housing Communities

Wentworth's four Thematic Communities are offered to incoming first-year students, that provides opportunities for incoming first-year students to engage in special interest housing. The 2025-2026 theme communities are: Women @ Wentworth, Wellness, Leadership, and Honors

Students who choose to live within one of these communities will be given the opportunity to live with a group of students who will share similar experiences throughout their first year at Wentworth. Living in a Thematic Community will help ease the transition into the college experience. The goal of these communities is to help first-year students find a sense of belonging on campus by growing personally, academically, and professionally.

On your agreement, you can indicate **one** thematic community. In order to be eligible for Honors, you must be accepted into the Honors program at WIT.

Roommate Matching Questionnaire

This section should be completed by the student. Please be honest with your answers as this is how the system will auto-assign you with your roommates and suitemates. As a reminder, you can pull in one other person as a roommate; however, most of you will have more than one roommate. The majority of our room types are triples and quads.

In the ***About Me*** section, indicate your interests. This will assist others in searching for a roommate.

If you want to opt out of being searchable, you will need to UNCHECK the box under the About Me section. If you want to be included, leave it checked.

Building Type and Food Plan Preferences

We have two building types for our first-year students. You can rank your preferences. This is a preference, not a guarantee. We only have so many spots in each building, so there is a chance that you will get assigned to your second choice.

Traditional Style: Baker Hall

A traditional-style residence hall like Baker Hall is designed around a community-focused living experience. Students typically live in double or triple rooms along a shared hallway, with common bathrooms and lounges serving the entire floor. This setup encourages frequent interaction, easy socializing, and a strong sense of floor identity. Traditional halls often support first-year students because the layout naturally promotes connection, peer support, and engagement with residence life programming. Baker Hall reflects this model by offering a straightforward, communal environment where students can build relationships and adjust to campus life with a strong support network.

Suite-Style: Evans Way and Tudbury

Suite style residence halls like Evans Way and Tudbury provide first year students with a group living environment that blends community and comfort. Students live in shared suites that typically include multiple bedrooms, a common living space, and a shared bathroom. This arrangement helps new students form close connections with their suitemates while still being part of a larger floor community. Suite style housing offers first year students a welcoming, collaborative space where they can build friendships, adjust to campus life, and engage with the broader residential community.

Food Plans

All students living on campus must purchase a food plan. Please select a food plan. You have up until the 28th day of class each semester to change your food plan selection. The food plan you select for the fall will be your food plan for the spring unless you make a change.

Platinum – Unlimited Anytime Meals + 150 dining points: \$3,520/semester

Gold – 225 Anytime Meals + 500 dining points: \$2,920/semester

Silver – 175 Anytime Meals + 700 dining points: \$2,563/semester

Accommodation Information

Student Accessibility Services provides support that allows students with disabilities to participate fully in the life of the community. Roommate Selection

All students can select up to one roommate for the upcoming year. Other roommates and suitemates will be auto-assigned by the portal.

You have three ways to select a roommate:

1. **Search for Roommates by Details:** You will use this method if you know the name of the person you want to live with
2. **Search for Roommates by Roommate Profiles:** You will use this method if you would like to search for a compatible roommate based on the application questions/answers.
3. **Suggested Roommates:** This method will provide you with the best-matched individuals.

Once you send out your request, the other student will get a notification on their portal. They will need to go in and accept the request.

Housing FAQs:

General Campus Living

Who is eligible for on-campus housing?

- Unless otherwise noted, all students must be enrolled as an active, full-time Wentworth Institute of Technology student in classes or co-op to be eligible to live in Wentworth-owned and/or operated residence halls.

- A full-time academic course load for undergraduate students is twelve (12) semester credit hours.
 - All exceptions to this policy must be approved by the Director of Housing and Residential Education (or designee).

Who is eligible to receive a housing assignment?

- Current active Wentworth **undergraduate** students who will be beginning their undergraduate studies this Fall 2026 semester.
- Students must have a completed housing agreement to get a housing assignment.
- If you are a graduate student or transfer student, your process looks different as we do not guarantee housing for those populations. We do our best to house everyone who needs it however, space on campus is limited. Graduate and Transfer students still complete a housing agreement. They are then added to a standby list. If we have space available after assignments are made, we offer them to those populations.

Where will housing be offered?

- Residential communities that will be open for first-year students for the 2026-2027 Academic Year include:
 - Evans Way
 - Tudbury Hall
 - Baker Hall

Are floor plans available?

- Floor plans of first-year residential communities can be viewed on our website.

Do I need to live on campus?

- Per our [residency requirement](#), all first-year and second-year students are required to live on campus. If you have questions about the residency requirement, you may contact the Office of Admissions.

- Housing and Residential Education reserves the right to relocate, place on hold, or other measures, if there is a potential policy violation.

Finances and Bills

What are the room and food plan fees for Fall 2026?

- Housing rates and food plan prices can be found [here](#). Housing rates are based on the final room occupancy rate selected during the housing selection process. All residential students must select a food plan.

Fall 2026 student e-bills will be active in June. How will I be billed?

- Students will be billed through the [Student Financial Services](#) on June 15.
- Students have been billed for the food plan that was selected during the completion of the housing agreement.
- Students will be pre-billed for a housing charge of \$6,648– the rate of a double occupancy room in a first-year area.
 - If a student is assigned to a room other than a double, the e-bill will adjust a few business days after placement.

Housing Assignment Questions

When will housing assignments be made?

- Students will be automatically assigned to a room assignment by July 15.

Can I select my own roommate?

- Yes, you can pull up to one other person as your roommate.

How are housing assignments made?

- The system will automatically assign you to a space based on your roommate and hall preferences, along with the information that you provided to us within the roommate matching.

Do I need to join a roommate pair?

- No, it is not a requirement for students to form a roommate pair.

Which halls are available to first year students?

- Baker Hall, traditional style

- Double and triple bedrooms
- Evans Way, suite style ranging in sizes between 7-14 beds total
 - Mostly triple and quad bedrooms, some single bedrooms, some double rooms
- Tudbury Hall, suite style ranging in sizes between 4-12 beds total
 - Mostly triple and quad bedrooms, some single bedrooms, some double rooms

Can residents of mixed genders reside in the same room?

- Yes, Wentworth offers mixed-gender housing.
 - If you are interested in Mixed-Gender Housing, be sure to make the appropriate selection on your housing agreement.
