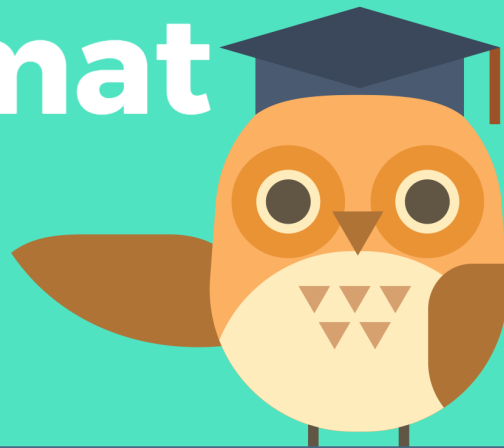
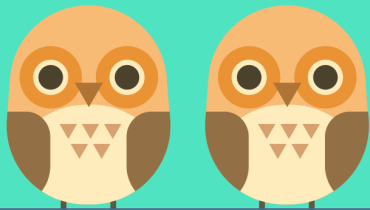


# Chicago format

how to cite text AND images



## 1 note



Put a superscript number<sup>1</sup> at the end of the information you got from the source. This is easy in Word using the "References" tab and clicking on "insert footnote."

## 2 footnote



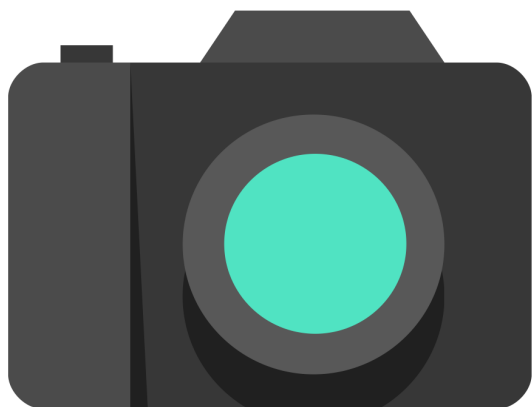
In the bottom margin of the page where you used the source, include a citation in the following format:

## 3 bibliography



At the end of the paper, list your sources alphabetically on the final page in the following format:

Lastname, Firstname. "Title of Article." In Title of Periodical, pg-pg. City, ST: Publisher, date.



## Images, including photos, are considered artwork.

Your caption will function as the footnote, and you will cite the image in the bibliography as well.

## citing images

Include the image in the body of the text, and underneath the image, give it a caption. For example, "Photo of the Guggenheim Museum in New York City, circa 2016."

If available, cite the artist/photographer as you would an author.

If available, cite the title of the work as you would the title of a book.

If none of these are available, you must still cite the image, using website name and date of access.

You will list the image in your bibliography including the date and location you accessed the image.
